equips programs with high-quality goods and supplies for children and families facing poverty.

OFFERING CLASSES & SUPPORT GROUPS GRANT

provides resource bags to individuals living on a low income as they work to achieve greater life stability.

OFFERING COACHING, CARE & CASE MANAGEMENT GRANTS (3)

provides tools and equipment to enhance individualized coaching and services provision for 45 people working towards greater life stability.

ENHANCING PROGRAM CULTURE GRANT

improves the physical space of a care and counseling program, making it easier for clients to open up and receive the emotional and spiritual care they need.

OFFERING WORKSHOPS GRANT

provides a high-quality workshop for more than 50 youth in need of emotional and spiritual support on their journeys to heal from past hurts.

CONSULTATION GRANTS (2)

supports a portion of UA's community resource coaching hub in the Greater Hartford community for more than 70 people facing challenges.

CHILD- & YOUTH-LED SERVICE PROJECT GRANT

supports a youth-led outreach project to provide comfort and meet the basic needs of people facing homelessness.
